Situated on the Gulf of Georgia at Nanoose Bay just north of Nanaimo, Moorecroft United Church Camp has been in operation for 50 years, and when not hosting summer children camps, we are available for group and private rentals.

We have hosted family reunions, weddings, craft retreats, and team building workshops. Kennedy Lodge has a fireplace and a beautiful ocean view; Vesper Point, and Cooks Point are incredible seaside venues for private services. Moorecroft is a peaceful and beautiful seaside retreat.

Accommodations

- Heated sleeping accommodations for 75 people, March through November
- Bunk beds in unheated cabins accommodate 50 or more, May through September.
- See the “Accommodation Listing” for more detail
- Day camps and meetings can be booked year round.
- Showers and toilet facilities available in two wash houses, Splash 1 and Splash 2

Overnight Camping

- **Full service - meals provided:** a day is a 24-hour period and includes 3 meals and up to three snacks if requested. A fresh fruit bowl is available at all times.
- **Facilities only, meals provided by client:** must be a minimum of 20 people. The kitchen in Stringer Hall is available for use, however at least one of the cooks must have Food Safe. Groups are asked to provide their own groceries, cooks’ helpers, do their own dishes, in addition to setting up tables and chairs in the dining hall, sweeping the floor, removing garbage to outside bins, and leaving the kitchen in clean working order. A Caretaker/Supervisor will be available for instruction and inspection.
- **Day Camps-** time period for day camp is 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. This includes the use of all the trails and picnic sites. Any meals in the dining hall will be charged per person according to the meal prices below.

Meals

- Stringer Hall can seat 80 at one sitting. The large, commercial kitchen is operated by certified staff.
- If your group is staying overnight, but has additional people who would like to come for the day only, they will be charged the day camp rate of \$8 plus any meals will be charged: Dinner - \$10.00, Lunch - \$8.00, Breakfast - \$7.00, Snacks - \$4.00.
- Special dietary needs such as vegetarians, vegans, food allergies and intolerances can be accommodated; information must be provided at least ten days before camp arrival. (there may be an extra charge if the amount of special food required is prohibitive)

Meeting Rooms

- Stringer Hall and Kennedy Lodge accommodate seminars, teambuilding workshops, and craft retreats.
- Stringer Hall has a capacity of 80 for meals and 105 for meetings, and Kennedy Lodge of 40.
- Rates: \$10.00 per hour or \$110.00 per day.
- Directors Cabin is available for smaller groups of up to 15.
- Meals can be provided (see above meal rates)

Registration information and regulations

- A \$200 deposit or 10% of the total bill, whichever is greater, is required before booking can be confirmed. 50% of the deposit is refundable if camp is cancelled with 60 days notice. 5% GST is added to all bookings
- All rental groups are required to provide proof of \$2,000,000 dollars liability insurance to rent Moorecroft or other authorized documentation
- Group numbers must be finalized and received by the camp 10 days prior to your arrival; otherwise you will be charged for the number of people on your reservation application form. If your group size is smaller than the number on your reservation form you will be charged for the number on your reservation form. Numbers higher than the registration figure will be billed when the group arrives.
- A list of all attendees – leaders and guests – must be handed in on arrival.
- Bring your own bedding and towels.
- Clients are asked to sweep out their cabins and remove garbage to the large bins before check out. Please leave the camp tidy. Any damages must be reported to the manager and payment arranged for repairs.
- Washhouses are maintained by janitorial services.
- This is a United Church camp; no alcohol permitted
- Smoking in designated areas only.

Activities

If you wish us to provide activities for your group a fee \$100.00 will be charged for 2 activity leaders to run 2 activities for 4 hours including set up and clean up. The following activities are available to assist you in planning your camp:

Waterfront

- Lifeguards are required for waterfront and equipment use.
- Cost per 4 hours for a lifeguard - \$100. A second lifeguard is \$80 for 4 hours, which includes use of camp waterfront equipment.
- Kayaking, swimming, snorkelling, and nature beach crawls are available May through September.
- Our bay is tidal and on low tide empties completely, therefore it is important to discuss waterfront programs with the office to maximize waterfront use.
